Zero Semester

3.07.1 According to Clause 05.13 of First Ordinance on arranging for, conducting and superintendenting of examinations the following provisions have been made with reference to "Zero Semester"

".....Normally, a candidate shall have to complete her/his degree within a stipulated number of semesters as prescribed by the Ordinance. However, under extraordinary/special circumstances, she/he shall be allowed to avail the benefit of zero semester with the approval of the Academic Council.

Provided that she/he shall submit an application in the prescribed format duly recommended and forwarded by the Principal of the College/Head of the Department to the Controller of Examinations at least 7 (seven) days before commencement of the end-semester Examinations. The Controller of Examinations within 15 days from the date of receipt of application shall forward the application to the Vice-Chancellor with his recommendation for his decision. The Vice-Chancellor shall consider the application of the candidate and may decide either to forward the case to Academic Council for its consideration and appropriate decision or reject the application. If the application is forwarded to the Academic Council, the student shall be allowed to continue in the next semester provisionally. In case the application is rejected by the Vice-Chancellor or by the Academic Council, the student shall discontinue her/his studies.

In the event of award of zero semester by the Academic Council, a candidate shall repeat the entire semester and could get a degree in more than the stipulated number of semesters.

3.07.2 In accordance with the above, for second semester examination (Spring 2009) the University has received 12 requests for availing the benefit of Zero semester out of which 7 cases as mentioned in Annexure were recommended to the Academic Council for approval.]

Apart from publishing of results, a core team headed by the Vice-Chancellor visited all the affiliated colleges in the state to present and discuss the results with the students and the teachers in September 2009.]

3.08.1 The Academic Council noted the results of **Spring (June 2009)** semester and also the follow up action initiated by the University after publication. This action included presentation of all the results paper-wise/subject-wise/class-wise in all the affiliated colleges by the University team led by

the Vice-Chancellor himself and also a thorough discussion on the same with the students and teachers in all the colleges. The Council placed on record its deep appreciation for both the remarkable improvement in the Second Semester results as compared to those of First Semester and also the novel and unique methods followed by the University to improve the performance of the students and the teachers. The House inter-alia made the following points.

3.08.2 The University should consider the introduction of Credit system at the earliest. But while doing so, it should be kept in mind that adequate number of faculties is available to manage that. In this regard, it was pointed out that the time-table adjustment is a major problem faced by many universities. The University may also consider deputing a study team to different universities like those in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh etc where the credit system has been implemented successfully. The University shall also consider introduction of remedial orientation programme for new students to enable them to cope with the learning methodologies followed by the University. The House suggested to the Vice-Chancellor to introduce an Incentive Scheme for meritorious students in each semester by which first 5 toppers may be given Rs.1000/- each out of Vice-Chancellor's discretionary grant.

3.11.3 The Academic Council was requested to consider and accept the above proposals and recommend the same for approval by the Executive Council.]

Minutes:

3.11.1 On the above, the House noticed that the University is presently running the Department of Physical Sciences under the School of Physical and Chemical Sciences. The Council directed the Vice-Chancellor to consider re-naming of this department as "Department of Physics". Similarly for the new course M.A. course to be introduced from the School of Media, Communication & Information Sciences, the name of the Department may be changed as "Department of Journalism & Mass Communications" instead of 'Department of Journalism'. The course content may also be designed accordingly.

3.11.2 The Council has also suggested introduction of a separate School of Education and desired the proposal for the same may be placed in the next meeting. Further the House desired that the University can also start Centres (Departments) on Leadership Development & History of North Eastern Region. Dr.Karunakaran has suggested that the University may depute a team to Maharashtra (Saurashtra Region) to study the functioning of *Lok Bharathi* schemes there and adopt its principles in designing the courses.

3.11.4 With the above suggestions the House approved the new programmes and endorsed the same to the Executive Council for accord of final approval.

AC:03:12 Pharmacy College lateral entry

[Agenda Note:]

[3.12.1 Himalayan Pharmacy Institute is one of the affiliated Colleges of the University. The college was given provisional affiliation for running the B.Pharm & M.Pharm courses for the Academic Year

2009-10. The intake capacity sanctioned for B.Pharm course was 60. The College has applied to the University in July 2009 for admission of 10% of students over and above the intake capacity under lateral entry scheme for Diploma Holders. It was made clear to the College that the question of admitting students under lateral entry would arise only if there are any vacant seats in B.Pharm Course. As the College has already filled all the seats and reached the intake capacity in full for the academic year 2009-10 admission of students to B.Pharm II Year under lateral entry scheme over and above the intake capacity was not in order. It was also mentioned to the college that the matter is being reported to the Academic Council for further directions in the matter.

3.12.2 Accordingly, the matter was placed before the Academic Council for directions on the following points

- I. Since the college has violated the extant provisions and admitted the students over and above the intake capacity the course of action to be initiated against it.
- II. Whether the affected students can be directly intimated by the University that their admission is not in order and therefore, the University is not in a position to allow them to take up the examination.]

Minutes:

3.12.1 The House has carefully considered the issue placed before it and also its possible future implications. After much of discussion, the House authorised the Vice-Chancellor to take appropriate action against the College and also intimate the Executive Council of the decision of the House.

AC:03:13 Improvement Paper Ordinance

[Agenda Note:

[3.13.1 The Academic Council in its last meeting held on 22.05.2009 as agenda item no AC:02:20 considered the proposal for introduction of Improvement Paper and also the First Ordinance made by the University on the above had noted and ratified it. As per the said First Ordinance the provision on Improvement Paper is as below.

(1) A candidate who has <u>failed¹</u> in one paper only in a semester shall be eligible for applying for Improvement. Such a candidate shall be promoted to the immediate next semester.

Provided that a candidate shall clear the Improvement Paper in the immediate next odd semester in case of Improvement Paper in odd semester and in the immediate next even semester in case of Improvement Paper in even semester.

(2) No candidate shall be allowed to appear in a particular Improvement Paper more than once. If a candidate fails to clear the Improvement Paper in the next designated semester, then even if he passes the immediate next semester examination, she/he shall be out of the system and shall discontinue from the course.

Provided further that a candidate shall be eligible for Improvement only twice in the entire course.

- (3) A candidate, who is promoted to the next immediate semester with Improvement Paper, need not attend classes in the paper in which he has been allotted Improvement Paper. The marks secured in the attendance shall be carried over. However, she/he shall appear in the term paper/practical, mid-semester and end-semester examinations along with the fresh batch of students in the college/Department in the paper in which he has been allotted Improvement Paper. The previous marks secured in term paper/practical, mid-semester and end-semester examinations shall be treated as cancelled.
- (4) A student, who is promoted with Improvement Paper, shall fill in a separate examination form and submit to the Principal of the College/ Head of the Department for appearing in the Improvement Paper within the dates notified by the University.

Provided that if a candidate fails to fill in the examination form for Improvement Paper, it shall deem that he/she is not interested in appearing in the Improvement Paper and also in the subsequent regular examinations.

3.13.2 The above ordinance is silent about eligibility of a student for improvement paper in the following situation.

Step -1 -The candidate fails in first instance (One or more subjects/by aggregate)

Step 2 -The candidate applies for re-evaluation

Step 3 - The re-evaluation results in her/his failing in one subject but maintains the required aggregate marks.

3.13.3 In order to make the provisions more clear, it is proposed to insert the following explanatory note below sub-clause (4) above of the above ordinance.

Explanatory Note 1:

If re-evaluation results in her/his failing of only one paper, the student can be allowed to be promoted to the next semester, with the failed paper as improvement paper, provided the candidate secures the aggregate marks as required.

3.13.4 Also, as per sub clause (1) of Clause 05.16 of the above ordinance it is found that the word "failed" has limited connotation. For example, a candidate may fail in "one subject" but have the necessary aggregate and the other may fail in "one subject" but do not have the necessary aggregate but both of them would be called as failed candidates. The Improvement paper concept would be available only to a candidate who failed in one subject and has necessary aggregate of marks. Therefore, in order to make the position clear, it is proposed to include one more explanatory note below Clause 05.16 as mentioned hereunder.

Explanatory Note 2:

The term "failed" in one subject shall mean failure in one subject with necessary aggregate marks.

3.13.5 The Academic Council was requested to kindly consider and approve the above amendment proposed.]

3.13.1 The House approved the insertion of the two Explanatory notes mentioned above in the first Ordinance on Examination below "Clause 05.16 – Improvement Paper "

3.13.2 The House recommended that the above amendments may be placed before the Executive Council for approval.

[3.14.1 Sikkim University constituted a Committee for framing ordinance on Financial Assistance to students in regular programmes from financially weak background but exhibiting a good academic record. The Committee accordingly made draft Ordinance for providing merit cum means financial assistance to the students. The Ordinance has been tentatively approved by the Vice Chancellor. The same are placed before the house separately for approval of the Academic Council. In accordance

with the norms set out in the guidelines, the candidates listed in Annexure have applied for financial assistance.

3.14.2 On approval of the Ordinance by the Academic council, the same with the list of candidates will be placed before the FC/EC for final sanction.]

Minutes:

3.14.1 The House approved the Ordinance on Financial Assistance to Students (Annexure M5) and endorsed the same for approval of Finance Committee and for final approval of the Executive Council.

3.14.2 The House has also approved the names of the students recommended by the Vice-Chancellor and endorsed the same to the Executive Council for approval.

AC:03:15	Draft Statute on Recruitment for Teaching Posts
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[Agenda Note:]

3.15.1 The Draft Recruitment rules for teaching posts were placed on the table for the approval of the Academic Council.]

3.15.1 The House considered the Draft Statute of Recruitment Rules for Teaching Posts (Annexure M6) placed before it and raised various points which were clarified by the Secretary. The House considered the fact the Statute has been made based on the provisions of Sikkim University Act and the orders of University Grants Commission on subject issued from time to time. The House noted that as per Section 18 of the Primary Statute of the University appended to the Sikkim University Act, 2006, in the case of Selection Committee for recruitment of Reader/Lecturer it mentions that one Professor to the Selection Committee will be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor. The House suggested that such nominated Professor may be either from the rolls of the University or from outside as the case may be – as decided by the Vice-Chancellor.

3.15.2 Similarly in the case of recruitment of Librarian/Deputy Librarian/Assistant Librarian etc the House desired ICT background should be specified as one of the essential qualifications.

3.15.3 With the above suggestions, the House has endorsed the Statute to the Executive Council for approval.

Draft Statute on Visiting Fellow/Faculty

[Agenda Note:]

[3.16.1 The Draft Ordinance on Visiting Fellow/Faculty was placed on the table for the approval of the Academic Council.]

3.16.1 The House considered in detail the draft statute on appointment of Adjunct Professor, Visiting Fellow etc (Annexure M7) placed before it. In order to keep the remuneration flexible, the House recommended that the same may be linked to the future increases as comes into effect from time to time on the recommendations of pay commission, amendments to General Financial Rules etc. The House also suggested that there should not any restriction on the upper age limit in the case of adjunct/visiting faculties in the Statute.

3.16.2 With the above suggestions the House endorsed the Statute to the Executive Council for approval.

AC:03:17	School of Policy Planning and Studies - programme
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[Agenda Note:]

[3.17.1 The Academic Council has approved the creation of School of Policy Planning and Studiesprogramme from the current Academic year. This School has been specifically created with the objective that a major portion of the academic programmes will be devoted to policy research that will cater to larger issues of national interest and are directly relevant to the management of regional and local issues including in the arena of public affairs, national security, livelihood and indigenous people, cross border interactions, disaster management and natural resources.

3.17.2 The Planning Commission has assigned a task of preparing a study report on Mid Term appraisal of the 11th Five Year Plan of Sikkim & Mizoram at the total fee of Rs. 17 lakh under the Central Plan scheme "50th Year Initiative for Planning". The School of Policy Planning and Studies has already started preparing the said report for submission to the Planning Commission within a month.

3.17.3 The above was reported to the Academic Council for noting.]

3.26.2 Of the above colleges, the Sikkim Government Law College had applied for starting of PG course (L.LM) and Himalayan Pharmacy Institute for starting of additional disciplines in M.Pharma in 2010-11, which have been referred to the Committee of Inspection for further action.

3.26.3 In this regard, it is brought to the notice of the Academic Council that almost all the colleges did not have adequately qualified faculty members and also lack in infrastructure facilities. By the results of last two semesters, the University has come to a conclusion that even the General courses have not been run by the colleges efficiently (especially in the Government colleges). In such case, starting of PG courses by these colleges would only ruin the academic progress of the students of the state. Unless these colleges equip themselves with trained faculty and infrastructure, providing them fresh affiliation to start PG courses would be nothing but futile.

3.26.4 Therefore, the University requests this august body to consider the above difficulty and can consider making a decision in principle that the University shall not approve any proposal from the affiliated colleges for starting of new PG courses at least for 2 more years. If some of the colleges find that they have some trained power to run the PG courses, Sikkim University can accommodate them on deputation or otherwise in its PG departments wherever feasible.

3.26.5 The Council was requested to kindly consider and convey its assent for the above.]
